10th to 11th century
All Saints' Church, Wing
10th-century nave, north aisle, chancel and crypt.

12th century
St Bartholomew, Fingest

Early 12th-century tower. Roughcast and render over flint with stone dressings. Romanesque openings with semi-circular roll-moulded arches on each side of the bell chamber.



13th century
St Nicholas, Cuddington

14th century
Church Street, Chesham

Timber framed 14th-century gabled house. Original carved wood tracery head.



15th century
Twyford Vicarage.

Timber framed hall of 3 bays

16th century
Chenies Manor House.

Constructed around 1530 by John Lord Russell. Walls of red brick. An important example of the early use of brick in the county.



17th century
Martin's Cottage, Cuddington

Timber framed, colour washed and rendered with chert frontage with thatched roof.

18th century
Church Street, Chesham

Timber framed, brick nogging and old tiled roof.



18th century
West Street, Buckingham

Grey brick, red dressing. Brick parapet. Classical doorway. Sash windows.

19th century
Bone House, High Street, Haddenham

Dated 1807. Colour washed witchert walls on rubblestone plinth. Decorated front elevation.



19th century
Aylesbury

Victorian terrace housing

19th century
Waddesdon Manor Waddesdon

Constructed 1874-1883 in style of 16th century French chateau



20th century
Wing Hall, Wing

Built 1905 in Rothschild style

20th century
New County Hall.

Twelve-storey concrete and granite building. Built 1963-66.
